PRE-JUNIOR 1 PRE-JUNIOR 2 JUNIOR CADETS DESCRIPTION **CRITERIA** NOTES 5 yrs - 7 yrs | 8 yrs - 10 yrs | 11 yrs - 15 yrs | 15 yrs - 18 yrs | 18 yrs and OVER AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER Unusual voice tone, avoid eye contact, frequently repeating noises, avoid loud noises, difficulty expressing feelings MENTAL RETARDATION Below average intelligence, limitate adaptive behaviors ASD WITH MR High intelligence, better than average verbal skills, inability to understand emotional issues, repetitive behaviors ASPERGER SYNDROME A-1-2 Δ-1-2-Δ-1-ASPERGER WITH MR XXX SYNDROME Delayed development of speech and language skills, learning disabilities, behavioral problems, low motor skills FRAGILE X SYNDROME Atypical social development, particularly shyness, limited eye contact, intellectual disability, difficulty with face encoding DANDY-WALKER SYNDROME Increased rate of psychotic spectrum disorders such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, mania or catatonia, intellectual disability PRADER-WILLIE SYNDROME Mild to moderate intellectual disability, compulsive behaviour, anxiety, psychiatric and behavioural problems. TOURETTE SYNDROME No visual motor integration and visuoconstructive skills, limited intellectual ability, attentional ability, and nonverbal memory APHASIA Inability to comprehend or formulate language, moderate speech repetition, mild difficulty in auditory compehension WERNICKE APHASIA Inability to comprehend or formulate language, mild speech repetition, defective difficulty in auditory compehension B-1-3-A-1-1 MASA Mental Retardation, Aphasia, Shuffling Gait, Adducted Thumbs LANDALI-KLEEENER SYNDROME Combined Autistic and Epilepsy symptoms DYSPRAXIA (DEVELOPMENTAL COORDINATION DISORDER-DCD) Sensory processing disorder, language impairment, motor coordination difficulties, intellectual disability, developmental disability Movement difficulties, seizures, problems with thinking or reasoning CEREBRAL PULSY NIEMANN – PICK DISEASE / NPC Type C Characteristics from Bipolar disorder, epilepsy, CP. 5p- SYNDROME Severe cognitive, speech and motor disabilities, significant intellectual disability ANGELMANN SYNDROME Severe intellectual disability, developmental disability, speaking problems, balance and movement problems, seizures EDWARDS SYNDROME Severe intellectual disability RETT SYNDROME Delays in gross motor skills, autistic-like features, apraxia, motor problems, seizures, may stop walking SILVER-RUSSELL SYNDROME Low muscle tone, dwarfism, severe constipation, body assymetry SMITH-MAGENIS SYNDROME Intellectual disability, facial abnormalities, difficulty sleeping, behavioral problems, self harm UPPER BODY DISABILITY sub cat 1. one arm, sub cat 2. no arms LOWER BODY DISABILITY (ONE FOOT) ATTENTION DEFICIT HYPERACTIVITY DISORDER (ADHD) Hyperactivity combined with Autistic symptoms and other syndromes such as Tourette, OCD, Epilepsy ADHD WITH MR AMSTERDAM DWARFISM Developmental delay, Intellectual Disability, Musculoskeletal problems, Social Anxiety, Seizures. DOWN SYNDROME mild to moderate intellectual disability, physical growth delays EPILEPSY Depression, anxiety, obsessive—compulsive disorder (OCD), seizures, social isolation, learning disabilities, some ADHD characteristics DOOSE SYNDROME Symptoms of Epilepsy, tonic-clonic seizures, myoclonic seizures, moderate psychomotor retardation, muscle stiffening DRAVET SYNDROME Prolonged febrile and non-febrile seizures, autistic-like behaviors, hyperactivity Epileptic symptoms, social isolation PANAYIOTOPOULOS SYNDROME JOUBERT SYNDROME Hypotonia, seizures, skeletal deformities PATAU SYNDROME Intellectual disability, motor disorder, some Down syndrome and Edwards syndrome symptoms AASE-SMITH SYNDROME Skeletal deformities, anemia symptoms BLIND PARTIALLY BLIND USHER SYNDROME Hearing loss, peripheral vision gradual loss DEAF PARTIALLY DEAF
